

Community Vision document


- Bridge between Information-gathering and visioning phase

- A first pass at the community's future







- Blacklick Estates

Land Use: Residential

- Sufficient range of housing options
- Don't want to see more residential development
 If it occurs, prefer single-family
- Want to see all or most farmland preserved
- Specifics
 - Insufficient housing options (BE)
 - Prefer mix of residential uses (BE)

Land Use: Commercial

- Consistent appearance important
- Satisfied with number and variety
- Specifics
 - Dissatisfied with number, variety (BE)
 - Dissatisfied with appearance (BE, EP/ME)

Parks and Nature

- Clean streams, wooded areas and natural areas important
- Satisfied with parks and recreational facilities
- Specifics
 - Need additional recreation facilities (BE)

Community


- Consistent appearance important
- Desire to stay in neighborhoods
- Desire access to fresh, locally grown food


Walking and Bicycling

- Walking
 - No sidewalks on residential streets but feel safe (EP/ME, CM)
 - Gaps in sidewalks or no sidewalks along major roads make walking unsafe (everywhere)
- Bicycling
 - Bicycling to commercial areas is difficult
 - Most desire connections to trails

Transit and Car

- Transit
 - Sufficient bus routes (EP/ME, BE)
 - Insufficient bus routes (CM)
 - Bus stop improvements would increase ridership (BE)
- Car
 - Speeding reported on main neighborhood streets and major rural roads
 - Road improvements needed





Vision


- Statements
 - Describes the future in words
 - Divided into topic areas
- Maps
 - Describes the future graphically
 - Land use, bikeways, sidewalk priorities and road improvements


Vision: How it's used


- Statements

 - Provides guidance to officials
 - What does the future look like?
- Maps
 - Helps guide future development
 - Communicates capital improvement wishes


Vision Statements

 - Use worksheet for edits/revisions









Public Meetings

 - Issues + desires = Proposed vision
- 2. Proposed vision, gather feedback
 - Proposed vision + feedback = Final vision
- 3. Proposed policies/actions to achieve vision
 - Proposed policies/actions + feedback = Final policies
- 4. Draft plan document
 - Draft plan + feedback = Final plan document
